William M. Singletary, MD

William Singletary is a child, adolescent, and adult psychiatrist, a member of the faculty and supervising analyst of the Psychoanalytic Center of Philadelphia, and President of the Board of the Margaret S. Mahler Child Development Foundation. He is in private practice in Philadelphia, PA and has worked in intensive psychotherapy with children and adults with ASD for over 30 years. He was instrumental in the formation of an international organization, INSPIRA, dedicated to psychoanalytic understanding, research and treatment of autism. Over many years Bill has worked to promote an interdisciplinary collaboration

involving psychoanalysts, psychologists, neurobiologists, pediatricians, and others working in the field of autism. A major focus of his work has been on how building relationships contributes to changing the brain. Since 2017 he has served as chairperson of the Autistic Spectrum Disorder Committee of the Department of Psychoanalytic Education of the American Psychoanalytic Association. He contributed the chapters on neuroscience for the book, *Autism Spectrum Disorder: Perspectives from Psychoanalysis and Neuroscience* by Susan Sherkow and Alexandra Harrison. More recently, his paper, "An Integrative Model of Autism Spectrum Disorder", which was a Target Article in *Neuropsychoanalysis*, describes the pathological role of stress in ASD, on both the neurobiological and psychological levels, and the importance of the development of loving relationships and emotional regulation in its alleviation.



Irith Barzel-Raveh Irith

Barzel-Raveh is Senior Clinical Psychologist and Supervisor. She is Organizational Consultant, Founder and Chairwoman of the Israeli Neuropsychoanalytic Society, Founder member and Board member of the International Neuropsychoanalytic Society. Irith Barzel-Raveh is a Senior clinical Psychologist and supervisor in Psychotherapy. She coordinated an interdisciplinary course at the Tel Aviv University Medical school of "Normalcy in Infancy". She taught "infant

Observation" in collaboration with Tavistock to multidisciplinary professionals. She was head clinical psychologist of the Neuropediatric infant development center of Tel-Aviv area and was head of 26 well baby transdisciplinary clinic. She is a specialist in the method of functional assessment of fetus General Movement of prof. Heinz Prechtel from Graz, Austria, of functional assessment of the brain. She is an organizational consultant from IFSI (International Forum of Social Innovation) from Paris. She enhanced the understanding of Group Processes, with the help of the IGA (Institute of Group Psychoanalysis). While she was co-chair of the scientific committee of the Israel association of psychotherapy, she joined the Institute of Ferenczi studies, initiated and coordinated a course "Ferenczi in the clinic" which was led in 7 countries around the world. She is in a PhD program in Psychoanalysis and Hermeneutics, at Bar-Ilan University, were she is working on her dissertation with the guidance of Prof. Mark Solms. She works at her private clinic.



Francesco Castellet y Ballará

Francesco Castellet y Ballará is a neurologist and psychiatrist who trained in the Italian Psychoanalytical Society (SPI). He is a Full Member of the SPI/IPA. He teaches Neuroesthetics in the University of Tor Vergata, Rome. He has a great deal of experience of international organisations, having served in IPSO and the IPA as committee board member. He is also one of the organisers of several editions of Festival dei Due Mondi di Spoleto: Cinema and Psychoanalysis, Art and Psy choanalysis sections. His main areas of interest are: psychoanalysis and neuroscience, early relational trauma and adult psychopathology, pornography, and money. He is currently the psychiatric and psychoanalytic consultant at the Italian site of the European Space Agency (ESA). He is co-founder of the Italian Psychoanalytic Dialogues Association.



Paul Moore

Paul Moore is a psychoanalytic psychotherapist, in private practice in Ireland. He is Course Director of the M.Sc. in Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy, in the Department of Psychiatry, School of Medicine, Trinity College Dublin and lecturers in psychoanalysis and neuropsychoanalysis in Trinity College and other third level educational institutes . Paul is a former Chair of the Irish Institute of Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy (IIPP), and is also a Training Analyst for the IIPP. He is a founding member and group leader of

Neuropsychoanalysis Ireland. In addition to general practice in psychotherapy, Paul specialises in psychotherapy for people who have experienced a brain injury, people on the autistic spectrum, and collaborates with Prof. Oliver Turnbull's Emotion Research Lab at Bangor University North Wales, where the team are investigating the neural correlates of psychotherapy, in this context Paul has worked psychoanalytically, both long-term and short-term, with people who have profound amnesia is a consequence of a brain injury.
